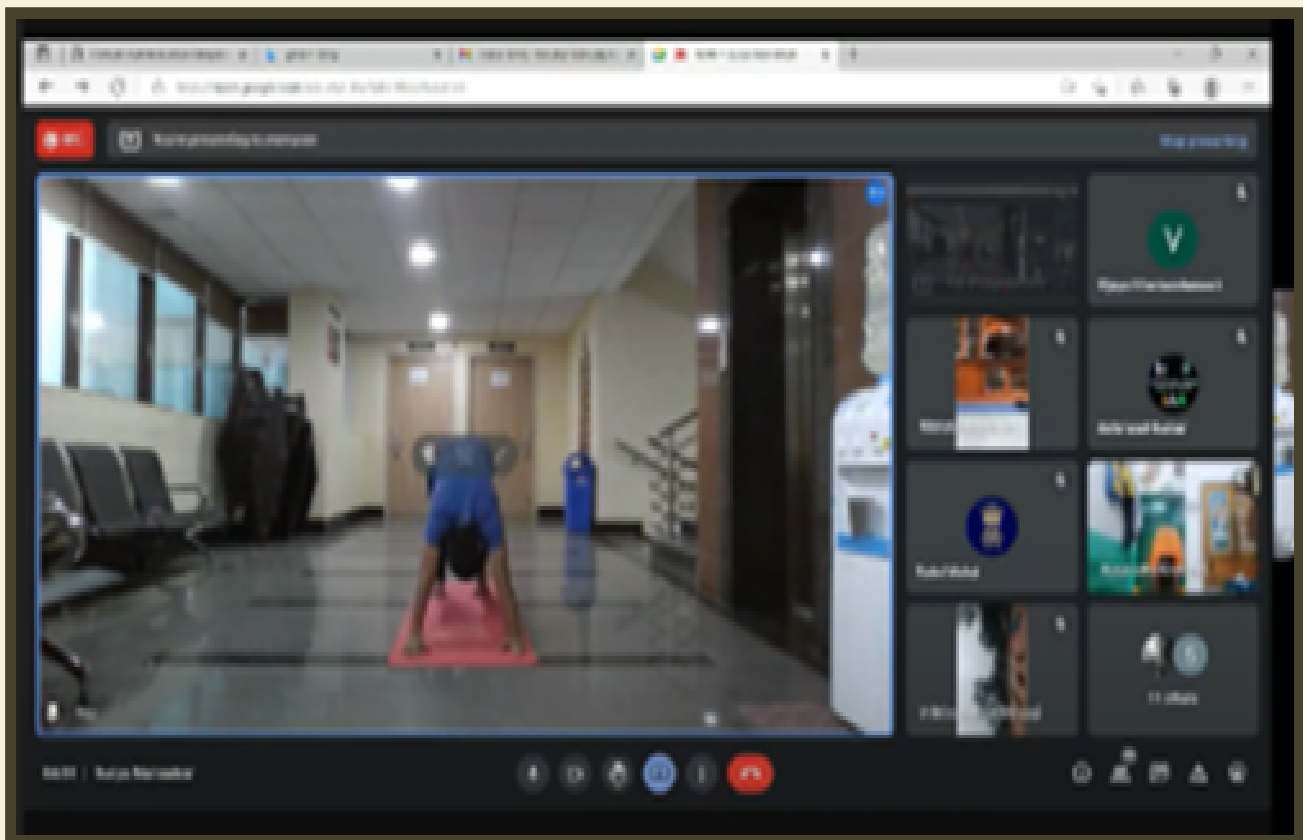


Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav Continues

development of the university. They appreciated the Founder Vice Chancellor Prof.S.A.Kori for his efforts in bringing various developmental activities even during the Pandemic.



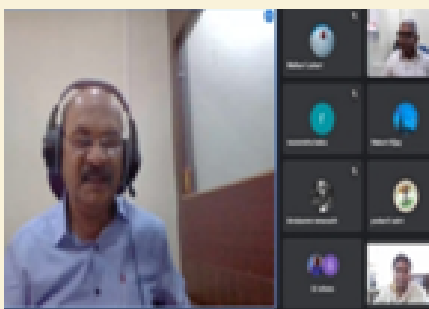
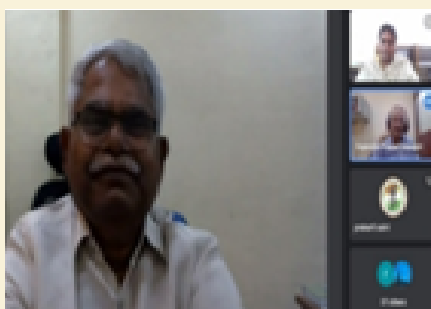
International Mother Language Day Celebrated

Webinar on the Union Budget

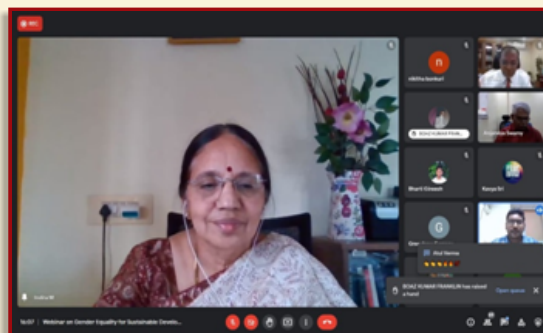

Distinguished Lecture – International Women's Day

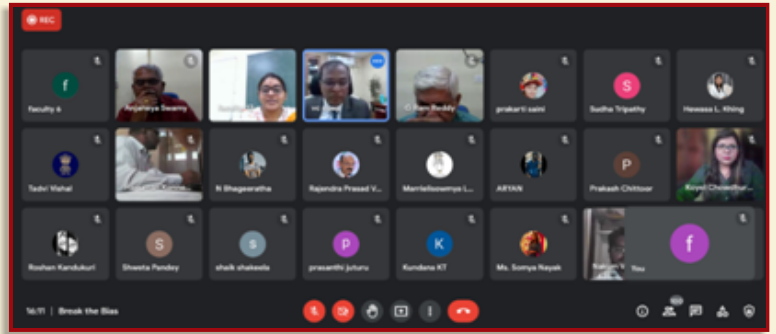

The webinar, organized on the eve of international women's day, was coordinated Dr Raju Chelle. It was presided over by Prof G Anjaneya Swamy. Chief Guest, Hon'ble Vice chancellor, Prof S. A. Kori shared his views on women's empowerment and observed that education is the most powerful weapon that can empower women and also make people realise the significance of gender equality.



In her address, Resource Person Prof M. Indira, Professor of Economics, University of Mysore, and ICSSR Senior Fellow, focused on Gender Equality and Sustainable Development. She observed that gender inequality was created by society as a whole and now it is facing consequences. She remarked that women are also good front-line workers in all sectors, not because of the reservation policy but rather the potential they have in multitasking. The latest train of thought that is motivating the present generation women is about health consciousness which enhances their emotional wellbeing.

AIU-MFF Safe Campus Program

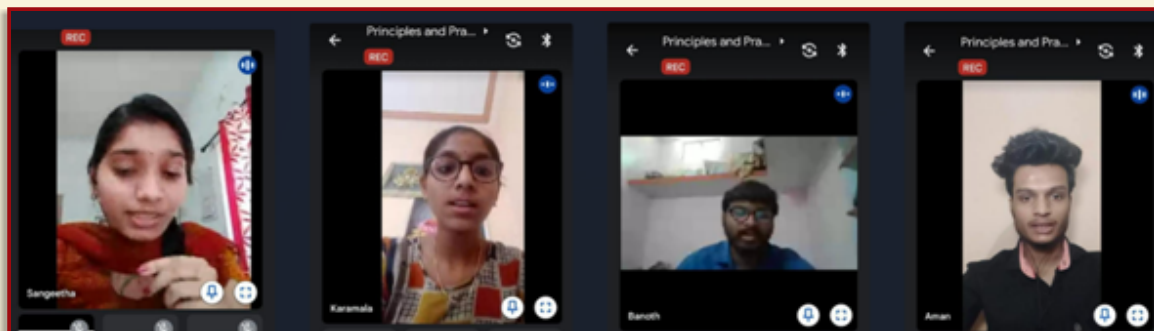
